This is exactly what we hope for in our work with Network Charter School (NCS) teens – to have a lasting, meaningful impact. And now more than ever, anything that improves the lives of adolescents is a huge plus.



If you didn't already know, Nearby Nature first started working as a partner with NCS over 20 years ago, when the school opened in 2003. At the time, we were serving young children through daycamps and school nature walks, but we were not consistently reaching teens. By collaborating with this unique new school, we could finally fill that service gap.


From water quality testing to fishing for rainbow trout, from organic gardening to urban hiking, our NCS teens now spend 6,000+ hours outside every year immersed in nature nearby. And when they need to be inside at our Alton Baker Park site, our cozy yurt serves them well, with custom-designed desks for project work, fast internet for research, and big windows that remind them that the healing space of nature is just a step outside the door.

I can still remember the first year I taught NCS classes at Alton Baker Park, when our beautiful Learnscape was only a dream, our chairs were hay bales, and our roof was a pop-up tent. We've come SO far since 2003! As NCS celebrates 20 years as a school and a community, Nearby Nature is right there at the table cheering. The school's students and staff have grown so much as people and partners along this journey, and I'm proud to have been a part.
