
Nearby Nature Summer 2026 Behavior Support & Camp Administration Internship

Location: Alton Baker Park in Eugene, Oregon *Updated 1-29-26*

Nearby Nature seeks a Behavior Support and Camp Administration Intern for the summer of 2026 to assist with our outdoor daycamps. Interns will develop and gain direct experience using a variety of the skills required in the fields of nature education and program administration.



At Nearby Nature, individuals with varied backgrounds, life experiences, and abilities are valued and encouraged to thrive. We are excited to teach – as well as learn from – all program interns and volunteers.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with camp activities (hikes, games, crafts, science projects, etc.) as needed, with a focus on supporting children who have identified behavior challenges – from kids with diagnosed conditions, such as ADHD, to kids who are simply having a rough day.
- Assist with administration, supply management, safety, and site upkeep as needed.
- Must be able to attend training prior to the start of camp (see below) – or be willing to work out an alternative training scenario if attendance at scheduled programming is not possible.

Qualifications:

- Enjoy spending time outdoors
- Experience supporting children with behavioral challenges
- Able to spend 4-8 hours on your feet (with appropriate breaks)
- Interest in program management
- Background in the natural sciences helpful but not required
- Responsible, safety-conscious (1st Aid/CPR training helpful but not required for application – will be needed by summer)
- Positive energy, sense of humor
- Committed to sustainable living
- Fluency in Spanish helpful but not required

Training Dates: Required training dates TBA at our site in Alton Baker Park. Natural history, teaching skills, leadership, and safety will be covered. Additional training opportunities TBA in spring 2026.

Credit Options/Stipends for Student Interns: Students are welcome to arrange credit if desired through individual professors, the UO Holden Center, the UO Career Development Center, the LCC Cooperative Education Program, or other appropriate local college departments. Out-of-area student interns are also welcome and we are happy to assist with credit requirements if sufficient information can be provided. A limited number of stipends are available for applicants who meet internship qualifications.

Time Commitment: Daycamps run in weekly sessions, June 22 – August 28. Each session has its own unique theme. Half day camps run 8:30am-12:30pm or 12:30-4:30pm. Full day camps run 8:30am-4:30pm. Interns must participate in trainings and assist at least four weeks of our 10 week season. Weeks do not need to be consecutive. For topics and dates see nearbynature.org/daycamps.
