Start of Summer Scavenger Hunt

Next time you go on a hike, see if you can find the things on this list. There's no need to collect stuff — just take pictures or check things off. For even more fun, turn finding these things into longer games. To learn how, read the notes in the ().

- Something that looks like the first letter of your name. (For a longer game, find all the other letters in your name.)
- Something that looks like a hand. (For a longer game, find something that looks like an arm, a leg, or a nose!)
- Something round. (For a longer game, also find something square, triangular, and rectangular.)
- A feather. (For a longer game, find as many other signs of animals as you can — footprints, nests, chewed leaves/nuts, fur, holes in the ground/trees, etc.)
- Something blue. (For a longer game, also find something red, orange, yellow, pink, green, purple, brown, black, and white.)
- Something with the same number of leaves as the number of letters in your name. (For a longer game, do this for each person in your group.)
